5. Why has a large crowd gathered in Jericho?
6. What is the blind man's first request?
7. Does God give us needs or a wants?
8. Why did people want to shut him up?
9. 'Sitting by the roadside' – does St Mark intend this to underline exclusion, someone not on The Way?
10. As a model of discipleship how would you rate the blind man's actions?
11. 'Son of David' cries the blind man. Why doesn't Jesus try to keep this form of address quiet and performs the healing publically not quietly this time?
12. Why does Jesus get others to call him over instead of going over to him?
13. Have your circumstances held you back for a while? Is Jesus calling you to get up, leave those circumstances and come to him?
14. What does 'throwing off his cloak' as a phrase convey to you? Does it remind you of anything?
15. What do we learn about Jesus that he asks what the man wants – isn't it obvious?
16. Why does Jesus say 'Go!' – what might we have expected?
17. The word 'immediately' occurs 41 times in Mark's gospel. In terms of writing why might this be used so often?
18. Why do we need another healing story? Is this here to emphasise something else?
19. How are faith and healing related?
