1. How are you preparing for the arrival of Jesus?

5. 'What are we here for, on earth?' – how would you answer that if a shopper asked you?
6. 'Jesus is Lord' summarises the gospel. What could it mean if we lived as though we fully believed it?
7. Which areas of your life do other influences reign more than Jesus?
8. How do you imagine the cloud to look like in which Jesus returns with great glory and power?
9. Are you afraid that you will fail to recognise Jesus when he returns?
10. From the passage, what active steps should we take when we become aware of the kingdom of God happening around us? (e.g. vv 28,29,34,36)
11. What climate do we need to create among congregations to see spiritual growth happening?
12. Do you live in the light of the hope that you have? What do you hope will happen when Jesus comes again? What will the new heaven and new earth look like?
13. V32 What is meant by 'this generation'? What could Jesus mean by 'all things'?
14. Have you given up living in the light of Jesus' return because it hasn't happened yet? How do we encourage one another to keep on living as if Jesus is returning in our lifetime?
15. A tee-shirt slogan once read, 'Jesus is coming – look busy!' What is the difficult truth behind this joke?
16. What is the threat to our hearts v34-36?
17. What could it mean to have strength to escape all these things? Which things?
18. How do imagine standing before the Son of Man will be like?
